Incident: Search Warrant – Two Arrests
Location: 178 Brown Road, Town of Wallkill, N.Y.
Date/Time: September 6, 2017 / 5:00 am

On Wednesday, September 6, 2017 at approximately 5:00 am, members of the Town of Wallkill Police Department executed a search warrant at 178 Brown Road. Members of the Orange County Sheriff's Office, New York State Police, City of Middletown Police Department and the Town of Wallkill Building Department assisted. During a search of the property, officers recovered property which had been reported stolen from several locations in the Town of Wallkill and Orange County. Marijuana was also found at the scene. Additionally, Building Inspector Charles Russell, condemned the building because of safety violations. The following residents were arrested at the scene:
