Incident: Three Arrests – Menacing
Location: 27 Brookline Avenue, Town of Wallkill, NY
Date/Time: December 27, 2020 / 12:42 am

On Sunday, December 27, 2020 at 12:42 am, Town of Wallkill Officers responded to a “Disturbance” at 27 Brookline Avenue. Subsequently, the defendants refused to exit the premises. After a period of negotiation, the suspects surrendered. A search of the defendant’s residence led to the recovery of two BB pistols. The first defendant, Mario Lopez-Huerta, 24 year old, male, City of Middletown resident, was arrested and charged with Menacing Second Degree and Harassment Second Degree. The second defendant, Enoch E. Lowe, 22 year old, male, Town of Wallkill resident, was arrested and charged with Harassment Second Degree. The third defendant, juvenile, male, City of Middletown resident, was arrested and charged with Menacing Second Degree and Harassment Second Degree.

The defendant, Mario Lopez-Huerta, was released on his own recognizance to appear before Judge Peter Green, at the Town of Wallkill Court on February 17, 2021 at 9:00am. The defendant, Enoch E. Lowe, was released with an appearance ticket to appear before Judge Peter Green, at the Town of Wallkill Court on January 6, 2021 at 9:00am. The juvenile defendant was released to his parent to appear in Family Court on January 11, 2021 at 11:00am.

A criminal charge is merely an allegation by the police that a defendant has committed a violation of the criminal law, and it is not evidence of guilt. All defendants are presumed innocent and entitled to a fair trial, during which it will be the State of New York's burden to prove guilt beyond a reasonable doubt.
