Incident: Robbery – Vehicle Pursuit – One Arrest
Location: Crystal Run Pharmacy, 390 Crystal Run Road, Town of Wallkill, N.Y.
Date/Time: August 31, 2016 / 5:57 pm

On Wednesday, August 31, 2016, at approximately 5:57 pm, Town of Wallkill Police Officer Brian Levy responded to a report of a “Robbery” at the Crystal Run Pharmacy, 390 Crystal Run Road. The officer was met by the victim, the store’s pharmacist. According to the victim, a short time earlier a male entered the store and demanded that the victim turn over narcotic pain medication and cash. The victim handed the suspect an undetermined amount of controlled substances and currency before the suspect fled the store. The suspect then fled the scene in a blue Mitsubishi sedan bearing New York registration DPJ 9265. At approximately, 6:01 pm Sergeants Julia Ashworth and John Adamec were responding to the scene when they observed the suspects’ vehicle traveling westbound on Route 211 at Route 17. When they attempted to stop the suspect he fled onto Route 17 westbound. The Sergeants pursued the suspect vehicle as it travelled west on Route 17. The suspect subsequently left the highway at exit 119 and continued to flee north on Route 302 before he was apprehended at Muller Lane and Route 302.

Charged with Robbery Third Degree, Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance First Degree and Criminal Possession of Stolen Property Fourth Degree by Police Officer Anthony Weed.

The defendant was arraigned in the Town of Wallkill Court before Judge Peter Green. The defendant was remanded to the Orange County Jail pending his next court appearance in the Town of Wallkill Court on September 7, 2016 at 9:00 am.

A criminal charge is merely an allegation by the police that a defendant has committed a violation of the criminal law, and it is not evidence of guilt. All defendants are presumed innocent and entitled to a fair trial, during which it will be the State of New York’s burden to prove guilt beyond a reasonable doubt.
