Incident: Arrest – Making Terroristic Threats
Location: Hudson Valley Federal Credit Union – 40 Lloyds Lane, Town of Wallkill, NY
Date/Time: May 24, 2018/4:18 pm

On Thursday, May 24, 2018, at approximately 4:18 pm, Town of Wallkill Police Officer John Zonneveld responded to a report of a “Disturbance” at the Hudson Valley Federal Credit Union, 40 Lloyds Lane. Upon arrival, a bank employee informed PO Zonneveld that an individual had telephoned and threatened to shoot bank employees. During the course of the ensuing investigation, the suspect, Paul Martin, 54 years old, Bloomingburg, NY, approached the bank where he was arrested by Detective Christopher DiNapoli. Martin was charged with Making a Terroristic Threat and was arraigned at the Town of Wallkill Court before Judge Peter Green. Martin was remanded to Orange County Jail on \$3,000 cash/\$10,000 bond until his next court appearance on May 30, 2018 at 9:00 am in the Town of Wallkill Court.

A criminal charge is merely an allegation by the police that a defendant has committed a violation of the criminal law, and it is not evidence of guilt. All defendants are presumed innocent and entitled to a fair trial, during which it will be the State of New York’s burden to prove guilt beyond a reasonable doubt.
