**Incident: Three Arrest - Burglary
Location: 7 Tucci Road, Town of Wallkill, NY
Date/Time: December 4, 2021/1:44 am**

On Saturday, December 4, 2021 at approximately 1:44 am, officers from this Department responded to a report of a “Burglary” at 7 Tucci Road. Among other things, the caller provided a description of the suspect’s vehicle. While enroute to the scene, responding officers observed the suspect vehicle and attempted to stop it. However, the vehicle fled and was pursued by officers before the vehicle was stopped, with the assistance of New York State Police, at the intersection of Crystal Run Road and Crystal Run Crossing. During the subsequent investigation, it was disclosed that the suspects unlawfully entered the residence, assaulted the resident then removed property from the home. The first defendant, Henry Bell, 37 year old, male, Brooklyn, NY resident, was arrested and charged with Burglary Second Degree, Criminal Mischief Third Degree and Menacing Third Degree. The second defendant, Dwayne Taylor, 41 year old, male, Garnerville, NY resident, was arrested and charged with Criminal Mischief Third Degree, Criminal Trespass Second Degree, and Aggravated Harassment. The final defendant, Maniger Dockery, 31 year old, male, Brooklyn, NY resident, was arrested and charged with Unlawful Fleeing Police Officer in Motor Vehicle, Aggravated DWI and Reckless Driving.

Dwayne Taylor, was released with an appearance ticket to appear before Judge Patrick Owens, at the Town of Wallkill Court on December 7, 2021 at 10:00 am. Henry Bell, was remanded to Orange County Jail, no bail and scheduled to appear before Judge Patrick Owens, at the Town of Wallkill Court on December 7, 2021 at 10:00 am. Maniger Dockery, was released with Uniform Traffic Tickets returnable to the Town of Wallkill Court on December 22, 2021 at 9:00 am.

A criminal charge is merely an allegation by the police that a defendant has committed a violation of the criminal law, and it is not evidence of guilt. All defendants are presumed innocent and entitled to a fair trial, during which it will be the State of New York's burden to prove guilt beyond a reasonable doubt.
